  - a. Preparation;
  - b. Motivation, especially self-motivation;

- 3. Own your assignment = Make it yours. This will make you be responsible and accountable for all your actions and outcomes.
- 4. Marry the Assignment commit to it no matter what! Certainly there will difficulty, inconvenience, setbacks. Remember always if there is one thing you take away from this talk Is this "Your setback is your set up for your come back" so when setbacks occur, embrace them as setting you up for better things...but also they will enable you enjoy the exhilaration of achievement.
- 5. Excelling at your assignment leads you to qualification
  - a. Qualification for promotion. Three years ago or whatever tome ago that you began you were not what you are today so you can see that because you excelled at your assignment, you have qualified to be at the 9<sup>th</sup> Graduation ceremony!
  - b. Qualification to be counted among.... (choose what it is you want to be counted among). As for today you can be counted as successful graduands of Cavendish University. Uganda.
  - c. Qualification for higher assignments new levels of contribution
